- Quality design and placemaking captured throughout this DAS in all Design Principles
- Key gateways defined by Gateways Design Principles
- Mix of buildings, spaces and characters identified throughout and in particular along active travel routes and the development access, where character will vary – as set out in Design Principles

- 4.2 Figure 88 compares the Composite Framework Plan, the key plan from the SMP of all framework layers, with the OPA Parameter Plan. The latter is necessarily a more technical drawing for the purposes of defining the OPA parameters, so it doesn't include features such as tree planting belts and buffers to key features such as the railway and existing properties (these are set out in the Development Specification). The Design Principles in the DAS address these issues, setting out requirements for the integration of existing development and need for buffer planting.
- **4.3** However, it is evident that in all material respects, the Parameter Plan is consistent with the Composite Framework Plan, including the following key parameters:
- Key access points into BA1 and broad alignment of development access
- Active travel routes Bygrave Road and Active Travel Spine
- Disposition of land uses including residential, schools, employment, health, employment and local centre
- Strategic green spaces and connectivity between them
- Retention of key ecological areas
- Sustainable drainage corridor at lowest part of the site
- · Retention and realignment of Public Rights of Way
- Three key gateways into the site

- **4.4** Two elements of the SMP Composite Framework Plan have evolved and are expressed differently within the OPA as follows, and as shown at Figure 88:
- 1. Extent of development on northern BA1 edge as explained earlier in the DAS, the design team has explored the possibility of extending development slightly further north than envisaged in the SMP, within the central part of BA1, whilst remaining in accordance with the Local Plan policy that requires development to be contained to the south of the ridgeline. This change has been captured in the Parameter Plan and tested through the Landscape and Visual Chapter of the ES, as well as the visualisations of this edge included within section 3 of this DAS.
- 2. Formal Sports the SMP proposed an area of Outdoor Sports within Bygrave Common, north of the residential area. Sport England have confirmed, in pre-application meetings that this area, proposed as for informal, junior pitch provision, was too small to function as a sports hub and as such this has been removed. The two sports hub areas will be at Eastern Park and within the Urban Open Land.
- 4.5 The OPA has been prepared in parallel with the SMP, allowing the Parameter Plan to capture the key components of the Composite Framework, such that the OPA Parameters are substantially in compliance with the SMP.
